

RAPS 360

Workstation System Requirements

There are two applications used with RAPS 360.

- RAPS 360 on a network is accessed by students through a web browser and is available on any recent web browser with the Flash Player 10 or later installed.
- The Universal Administration and Reporting Center (U-ARC) is class/student management program and is also accessed through a web browser.

Windows

CPU	1Ghz (or better)
RAM	256 MB
Operating System	Windows 2000, XP, or newer
HD Free Space	500 megabytes
Web Browser	Internet Explorer 6.0, Mozilla Firefox 2.0, or equivalent (Flash Player 10 or later required)
Available Bandwidth	256kbps (both up and down) for every 20 concurrent connections (Minimum 512kbps both up and down)

Macintosh

CPU	G4 or better
Operating System	Mac OS 10.2 or higher
RAM	512 MB
HD Free Space	500 megabytes
Web Browser	Safari 1.3, Mozilla Firefox 2.0, or equivalent (Flash Player 10 or later required)
Available Bandwidth	256kbps (both up and down) for every 20 concurrent connections (Minimum 512kbps both up and down)

Note: The Safari browser does not support the ability to detect when students exit the program by closing Safari. If Safari is used, the system will still see these students as being logged in and may need to be logged out by a teacher.

"Available bandwidth" is the amount of free network bandwidth available on the network connection when network traffic is at its highest. Note that some Internet connections (like DSL and cable) have a independent upload speeds (usually 256kbps) this could have adverse effects if using MindPlay's Internet server.

Note: FLRT cannot be installed as a stand-alone on a Macintosh. It must be connected to either a Windows server at the school/district level or to MindPlay's Internet server.

RAPS 360

Server System Requirements

There are four potential server configurations:

1. **Local Area Network (LAN)** – This means the RAPS 360 program is hosted on a server at the school.
2. **Wide Area Network (WAN)** – This means the RAPS 360 program is hosted on a server at the district level and accessed by multiple schools.
3. **Internet** – This means the RAPS 360 program is hosted on MindPlay's Internet server.
4. **Stand-alone** – This means the RAPS 360 program is installed completely on specific workstation.

For Internet and Stand-alone configurations, the server requirements listed below would not apply.

Local Area Network

CPU	2Ghz (or better), one processor or core for every 50 concurrent connections
RAM	1 gigabyte RAM, plus an additional 512 MB for every 20-30 concurrent (minimum 2 GB)
Operating System	Windows Server 2003 or newer (64-bit support is limited to Windows Server 2008 and above)
HD Free Space	4 GB

Wide Area Network

CPU	2Ghz (or better), one processor or core for every 50 concurrent connections
RAM	1 gigabyte RAM, plus an additional 512 MB for every 20-30 concurrent (minimum 2 GB)
Operating System	Windows Server 2003 or newer (64-bit support is limited to Windows Server 2008 and above)
HD Free Space	1 GB
Network	100-megabit Ethernet on the internal networks. 256kbps (both up and down) available bandwidth for every 20 concurrent RAPS 360 connections between the district/organization and each of the individual schools/sites.
Other	Someone at the district-level needs to be in charge of the program as a whole—adding schools to the database, allocating connections to the schools and retrieving lost/forgotten passwords for the program administrators at the schools.

Note: A non-dedicated server may require more RAM, processing power and/or processors, depending on what else is running and how heavily used the server is.
